This week I received a few thoughts to ponder from a friend. Actually, it was 26, but here is a sampling:

- Is it a good vacuum cleaner if it sucks?
- If a word is misspelled in the dictionary, how would we ever know?
- Why do we say something is out of whack? What's whack?
- Why do "slow down" and "slow up" mean the same thing?
- Why do "fat chance" and "slim down" mean the same thing?
- Why do "tugboats" push barges?
- Why are a "wise man" and a "wise guy" opposites?
- Why do we put suits in a garment bag and garments in a suitcase?

Years ago, a young man, about 6-years-old, came out of the sanctuary in the springtime and asked me, "Why is the day Jesus was executed called, 'Good Friday'?" It's certainly worth pondering, especially for a 6-year-old! The fact is, I know plenty of adults who have never asked that question or pondered it!

So, why is the day that Jesus was beaten, scorned, and savagely put to death in all His nakedness on a roughhewn cross called "good". The earliest known use of the term "Good Friday" was in a British dictionary published in 1290. They said the term derives from "God's Friday". It is the day in which mankind did its worst, yet God did His best.

New Testament Scholar, D.A. Carson, writes, "It was not nails that held Jesus to that wretched cross; it was His unqualified resolution, out of love for His Father, to do His Father's will, to demonstrate God's love for sinners like me." So, Good Friday is a great day, for on that day He traded places with us. He took all of the divine judgment of sin that each one of us deserved. On that day Jesus conquered sin and death so that we will never be separated from God on this side of heaven or the other.

If you had asked His friends, or His mother, on that day if it was a "good day", they would have unequivocally said, "Absolutely not!" But by Sunday evening, they would have changed their response dramatically.

While every one of those questions to ponder have a clear answer, but no answer is clearer and more consequential than the one that answers the question, "Is Good Friday really good?" Praise the Lord it is! The Best Day!
