Redemption With A Capital "R"

Six years ago, on tax day, I wrote an article that came back to bite me. There was a dear, elderly woman who had been in decades of Bible study with me who took serious exception to what I had written. In fact, she even wrote me a letter of disgust. But my intention was not to offend her. The truth is, I wasn't even thinking of her when I wrote it. I was thinking of what had happened the previous day and Donald Grey Barnhouse's line that all of life illustrates biblical truth. That's what I had witnessed hours earlier in spades.

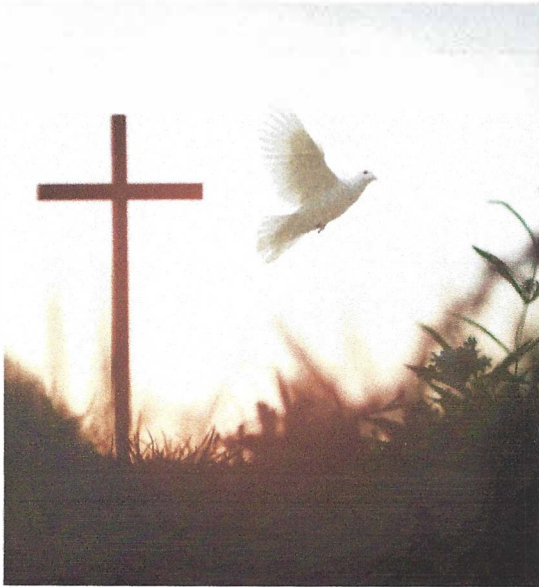
Another man captured it well. He wrote, "I'm not a golf fan. Until the weekend before Easter I had never watched golf on television. But when I heard that Tiger Woods was in the last group at the Masters, I tuned in. I've been quietly rooting for Tiger Woods for years. From the moment news of his troubled life made headlines, ten years ago, I went from indifferent to feeling compassion for him. Whenever I've heard his name on radio or televisions, I've said a quick prayer for him. Not for another tournament win, but for redemption with a capital "R."

"You see, I have an odd connection with him. Our lives, our goals, our sins are not the same, but I have known what it's like to attain something and then lose it. I've known what it's like to hurt those you love. I've known what it's like to struggle with painful memories of self-inflicted wounds that refuse to be buried. I've known friendships that weren't what I thought they were. And I've known what it's like to be delivered over to a vicious media all too willing to gleefully aid in your destruction if it gets enough clicks.

"But Sunday showed the world what forgiveness and grace look like. Less than a year ago he couldn't even walk after four back surgeries.... His win at the Masters was such an accomplishment that Sports Illustrated did something it's never done in its 65-year history. They put a picture of Tiger on the cover after his win without a headline. They didn't name him, or the sport, or the event, or its location. In the opinion of the editors of Sports Illustrated, the picture spoke for itself.

"What's next? He and Elin reconciling? Now that would be an even bigger story. I don't know Tiger Woods and I don't dare judge him... he's endured enough of that.... Rather, I pray that in light of his recent triumph... he gives credit to God whose grace is so remarkable that He bestows a measure of it even on those who don't know Him. I pray for Tiger Wood's redemption not so much on the golf course, but in real life... For the greatest wonder of God's forgiveness and redemption is that it's available to everyone. While many of us want to withhold it, the Lord never does."

Two days after the Masters a woman called the office to talk to me. As soon as I returned and saw that she had called, I knew what she wanted. You see, her husband didn't like Tiger Woods. In fact, every time he'd see him on TV he'd turn to her and say, "There's Dougie's boy." We used to watch some tournaments together and I'd hear of his disdain for Tiger, and I'd kid him about it. So, when I called her back, I wasn't surprised to hear her say, "Did you see Tiger on Sunday? Oh, how Don would have loved to watch that with you and talk about it!" As soon as she said it I thought, "She's right!" And the reason she was right was because Don had come to know what that writer is talking about. In the final years of his life he came to experience the radical grace of God in Jesus Christ. He went from a church attender to a Jesus lover. He came to really know the truth, that grace always flows downhill!

That's why, for so many, the cross is so scandalous. And no one understood that any better than the Apostle Paul. Listen to what he says at the beginning of 1 Corinthians, "When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with lofty speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." Now think of all that things he could have talked about. Think of all the things he could have taught them. He had been with the resurrected Christ for months in the desert of Arabia. Imagine those conversations and stories! But he chose to talk about none of that. Instead, he chooses to talk about only the cross.

Someone has said, "The whole purpose of God, for all time and eternity, is the cross." The cross is the measure of every life. What happens at the cross is the determining factor of all eternity and the resurrection proves it. And what drives Paul to that conclusion is not only what Jesus does on the cross, but what He says. And the first thing He says is, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." You see, it's not just the soldiers, the priests, the Pharisees and Pilate He's talking about. He's talking about that writer, that woman, that golfer, and you and me.

One anonymous poet put it this way, "Upon a life I have not lived. Upon a death I have not died - upon another's life and another's death, I have staked my whole eternity." You know why? Because grace only ever flows downhill and that's a message that only requires one picture and that's a picture of the cross.

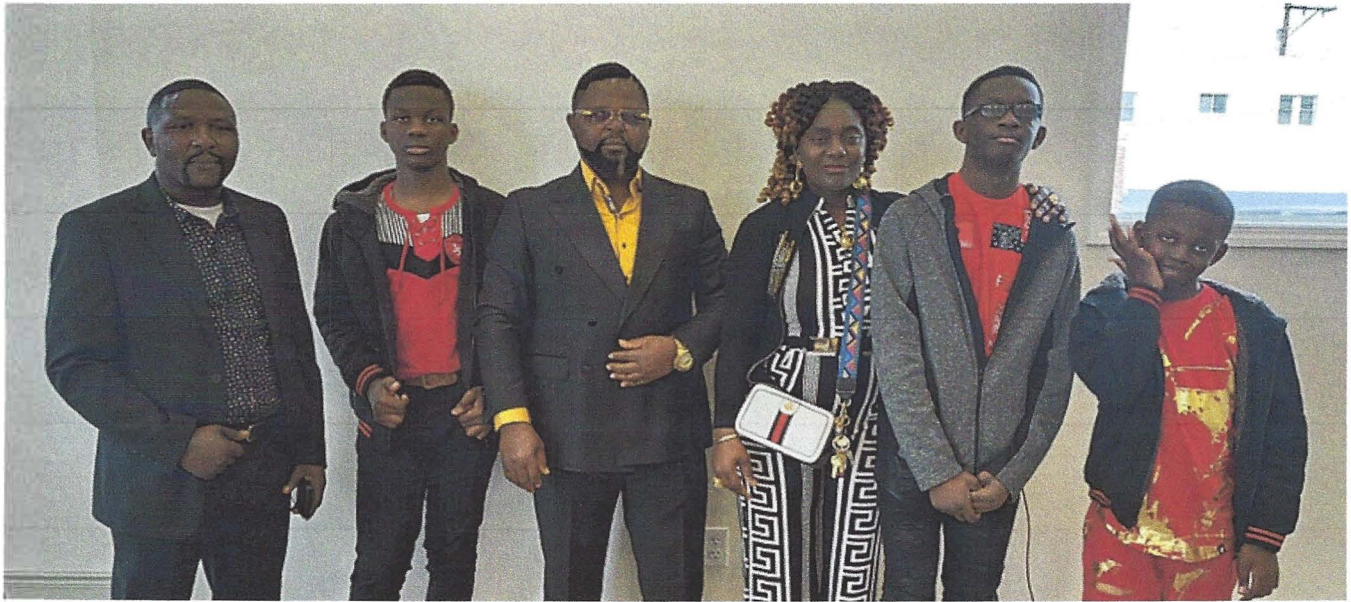

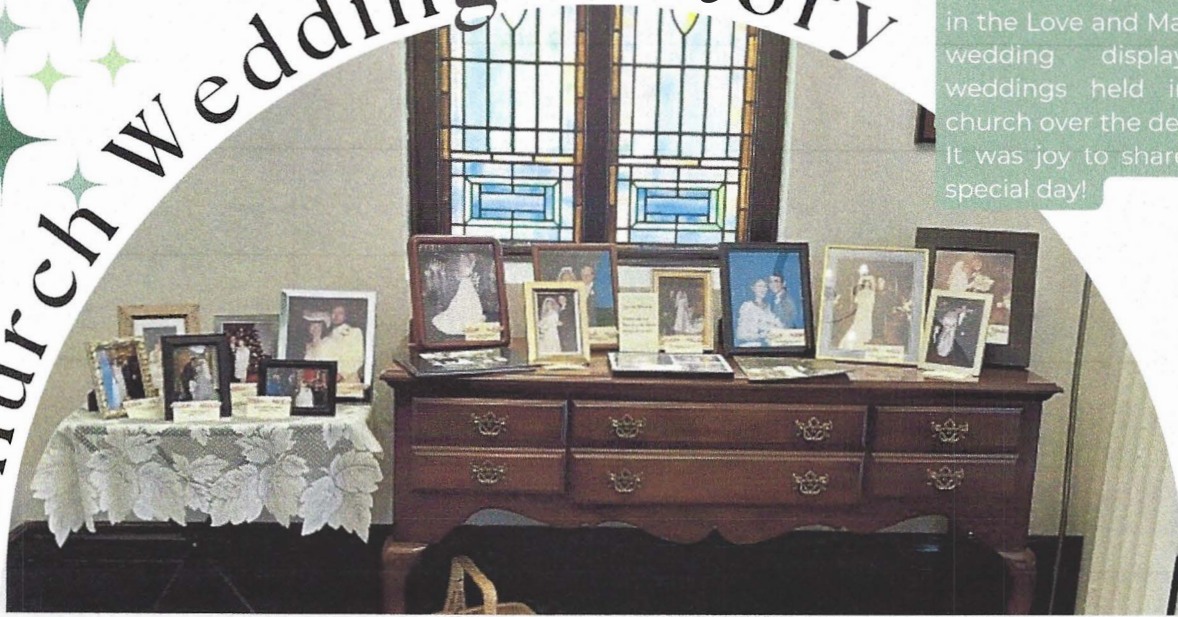
