



Heaven's Trump Card

This week I was reminded of a survey conducted in October of 2020 by an online Roman Catholic journal. They asked their readers if they could actually identify the policy differences between Donald J. Trump and Joseph R. Biden. It was one month before the Presidential election.

In less than 10 minutes there were 50 responses. One read, "I just hate the way he talks." Another said, "In my opinion, the guy's too far gone; he's demented." Another replied, "I just feel that he cares more about the little guy than the other one does." In more than 100 responses, the focus was on personality rather than policy, as if one's feelings and subjective opinions can guide a person to know who someone is and what he will do!

On Thursday, August 21, two days after President Trump did a telephone interview with a morning television show, Kinsey Crawley, a USA Today reporter, asked in an editorial, "What religion is he?" Maybe you saw the article, or at least heard Trump's statement on August 19th.

He was speaking about his recent telephone call with Putin during his meeting with Zelenskyy and the other European leaders at the White House. The President said, "I wanna end the war. You know, we're not losing American lives... we're losing thousands of Russian and Ukrainian soldiers every day, along with countless civilians. I wanna try to get to heaven if possible. I'm hearing I'm not doing well. I am really at the bottom of the totem pole. But if I can get to heaven, ending this war will be one of the reasons."

Now, if you've followed Donald Trump very long, you know that his speech is often peppered with colorful bravado and hyperbole. Some long-time observers have said, "When it comes to Trump, you must follow not what he says, but what he does." And while that may be true, in this case it's instructive to take a few minutes and reflect on what he said in that interview. You see, it's one thing to casually utter deceptive statements or engage in colorful misspeak, but these statements reveal an unsettling misunderstanding of heaven and access to it that is rife in the world today. When the President says, "I wanna get to heaven, if possible," he's uttering a universal desire that spans generations and every socio-economic, racial, and political boundary.

Dr. David Martyn Lloyd-Jones, the famous theologian, medical doctor, and pastor of the last century, used to say that whenever he'd ask someone if they were a Christian and they responded by saying, "I hope so", or "I'm working on it," he'd immediately know that they knew nothing of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For the heart of the Gospel is summed up in one word - SUBSTITUTION.

Maybe it's the paucity of biblical preaching and teaching today. Maybe it's the absence of Bible reading and



study. Maybe it's the overwhelming stoutness of the self-reliance that permeates our sinful hearts. Whatever the cause, the result is the same, spiritual blindness and death.

The heart of the Gospel is this: God paid everything necessary to reconcile sinners like us to Him. Rather than sentencing us to what we deserve judgment condemnation - He sentenced Himself in our place. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is stark: God died the death we should have died. God lived the life we should have lived, so that we might stand in Him complete - now and forever. You see, the truth of the Gospel makes the statement, "I'm working on it," a damnable myth. Trying to work our way to heaven is like attempting to dig our way to China with a teaspoon. Yet, most try. Regardless of one's policies, position or personality, that's a fool's errand.

"Nothing in my hands I bring, Simply to the Cross I cling."


Youth Choir






Led by Gary Filson in room 120.


