The Cost of Christmas

Joseph Scriven was born in Ireland. He graduated from college and was engaged to a beautiful girl whom he adored. On the eve of their wedding his fiancé drowned. Within weeks of the tragedy, his mother grew gravely ill and died, His response to the dual tragedies? He authored a hymn that goes like this, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear...". But I ask you, what kind of friend is it who takes your fiancé and mother in the span of a week? A loving one?

Years ago, when Bishop Madras was visiting an obscure, out of the way South American village, he walked into a mission the church had established there and was introduced to a young slave girl who had the title, "The Child Apostle."

The bishop had never laid eyes on this young woman before, but he had heard of her from numerous sources. He had heard about her fervor for Christ and her intense zeal for sharing Jesus with others. When he finally saw her, his countenance fell. Just looking at her he knew what had happened. Her little smile did nothing to mask the horror of her appearance. Her face, neck, and arms were completely disfigured. Her legs were a mass of welts and scars. As he stared at her, his eyes began to well up with tears. "My child," he said, "how could you bear this?" She looked at him with surprise and said, "Don't you too like to suffer for Christ?"

Let me ask you, what kind of Christ would allow a little girl to suffer incessant abuse from those who hated the message she'd deliver about Him? A loving One?

We talk of a loving God, what He will do and what He won't do. And nearly every time, we use our own standard of what we think love is. For most of us, we believe love to be something soft, gentle, human; something consistent with what we believe is right. Yet, while we may hold a variety of definitions of love, God only holds one. It's perhaps, most succinctly stated in I John 4:10, "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the necessary sacrifice for our sins." Where's the softness and gentleness in that? Where's the correctness in that? It's replaced by a different standard of love. Softness is replaced by sacrifice.

In all the hustle and bustle of this year's Christmas preparation and execution, there's a tendency to miss the essence of God's love to us at Christmas. While many seek to make the manger a soft and gentle place, it's but Jesus' first stop on His journey to the cross. Out of God's incomparable love, He came to suffer and die for us. Think of it. He was born so that we could be born again. He was obedient so that all of it would rebound to us. Everything He did in 33 years was to satisfy the righteous requirements His Father had placed on us.

The Child Apostle was right. There's no love without cost. Every attempt to follow a suffering Christ without suffering, a stigmatized Christ without stigma, puts a lie to the self disclosure of God in Jesus Christ.

Paul puts it this way, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or sword? No! In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." These words speak not about immunity from suffering, but our inseparability from Him in the midst of it. Indeed, that's what Christmas is all about.


