Out of Sight, Man! Out of Sight!

I hope you are enjoying our study of the Book of Exodus every Sunday morning. I also hope that you are taking advantage of each week's sermon preview that gives you a little bit more information and context than you get on Sunday morning alone.

I once had a friend named Vance who played the piano alongside Jimmy Sapianza and the Pittsburgh jazz band, "Five Guys Named Mo." As you may know, all the guys in the band were terrific musicians, and some were blind.

Vance used to say that many times he'd be downtown and invariably see a member of the band on the street. When he'd see one of them, he'd cross the street and say, "Hey Jimmy, how are you doing?" Jimmy would always look in his direction and say, "Out of sight, man! Out of sight!"

There's a lot in the Bible that's out of sight. Like the Red Sea crossing. That's out of sight, man, out of sight! Like water flowing from a rock that followed the nation of Israel in the desert. That's out of sight, man, out of sight! But you know what else is out of sight in the Book of Exodus as the people of God live in the wilderness of Sinai? It's what Moses receives from God on his third trip up the mountain. You find it in Exodus 24.

Now, when most think of Sinai they think of the Ten Commandments and the Law of God. But, to the writer of Exodus, there's something more important that Moses receives on the mountain than the law. In fact, it occupies 20 times as much space as the Ten Commandments. Someone has said, "Today, the pyramids of Egypt and the catacombs of Rome are never failing objects of interest. The same is true of the abbeys of England and the Taj Mahal of India. But what is neglected is the Tabernacle of God."

When I was at Princeton, we were required to read tomes on the authorship of the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Bible). We were required to spend countless hours examining the vagaries of higher criticism. You say, "What's that?" It doesn't matter. But what does matter a great deal got no attention. You know how much time we were forced to spend gleaning from the fruitful fields of the tabernacle? Zero. And that's odd because God, in all His wisdom, spends 25% of the story of redemption on the design and building of His Tabernacle.

You say, "How could Princeton render such a disservice?" Because for them, the Tabernacle was out of sight. We don't want that to happen at First Presby. That's why, as we continue our study of the Book of Exodus, over the seven Sundays of Lent, we are going to dig into the Tabernacle and the seven pieces of furniture in it. Why? Because each piece speaks of the power and work of Jesus Christ. Not only fascinating, it's illuminating! Please make every effort to be with us as we dig in.

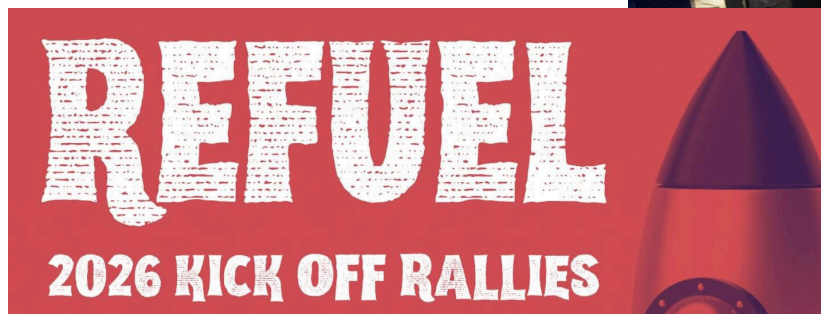

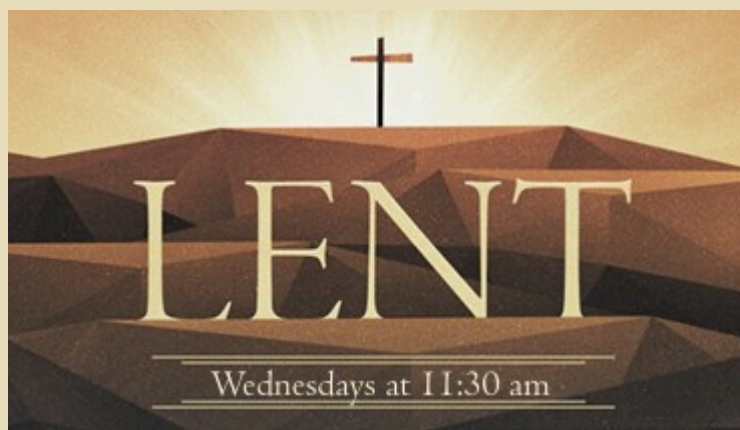

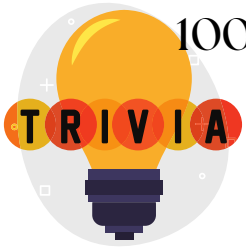
GriefShare will begin again ~

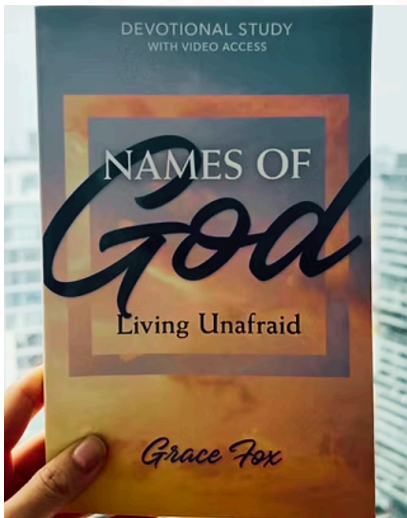

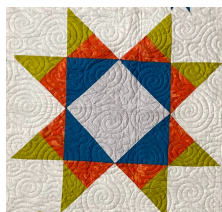
