A Matter of Identity

Three ministers got together for coffee one morning to discuss some problems they were having in their respective churches. After a few minutes of discussion, they all found that they had the same problem - bats in the belfry. One man said, "I got so mad I took a shot gun and fired six rounds at them." The others said, "Did that get rid of them?" "No," he said, "All I got were holes in the plaster."

Another said, "I set traps." The others asked, "Did they work?" "Oh yes," he said, "I caught every one of those bats. But after driving 50 miles and releasing them into a barn, they were back in the church belfry before I arrived." The third man said, "I feel sorry for you guys. I got rid of mine just like that." The others said, "Well, what did you do?" The man said, "I baptized them, and I haven't seen them since."

Now, if you have been around the church very long you know that that's not just true of bats. Parents often come forward in worship to present their infant child for baptism, and then they disappear. And it's not just parents of infants, the same can happen with adults. They come forward full of enthusiasm to present themselves for baptism, and after a while they disappear. It can happen in any denomination. It can happen in any church. It's so prevalent that it prompts the question, "So, what's it all about?" The simple answer is, "It's all about your identity in Christ."

Forty-six months ago, Barb and I came to this church as strangers. We were confident in our identity in Christ, but not in this church. You didn't know us, and we didn't know you. But quickly, everything changed. Soon we had become friends and colleagues in ministry who shared a common purpose - to "Bring the Heart of Jesus to the Heart of Irwin." No longer was this a place to put in time. Personal priorities began to shift. We started to identify with one another as brothers and sisters in Christ who share the joy of working to increase the family of faith.

Evidence of this change was considerable last year. At this time last year, we had never witnessed a "January Thaw." We had no idea that we could raise over \$8,000 to support the ever-growing work of changing lives through Carpenter's Apprentice. Last year at this time, we had no full-time Children's Ministry Leader or Administrative Assistant. Neither had we occupied the new building for more than seven months. We were still getting our feet wet in using it to serve the Kingdom of God.

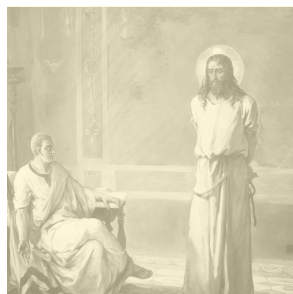
In the summer of 2025, we experienced weak financial giving and inadequate accounting, leading the Session to propose only a modest increase to the 2026 budget. However, all of that began to change in the fall as giving increased and Karen Crissman came onboard as our full-time treasurer and Administrative Assistant. The fact is, today our financial position is the best it's been in years.

All of us have much for which to be thankful as we enter this new year. The Lord continues to draw people to us to love and serve. For those who see First Presby as a place to attend on Sunday morning out of habit or ritual, we are grateful for their presence. But our deepest longing for them, and for us, is so much more substantial than that. Let's resolve this new year to prayerfully and intentionally live our real identity together and see what the Lord will do.

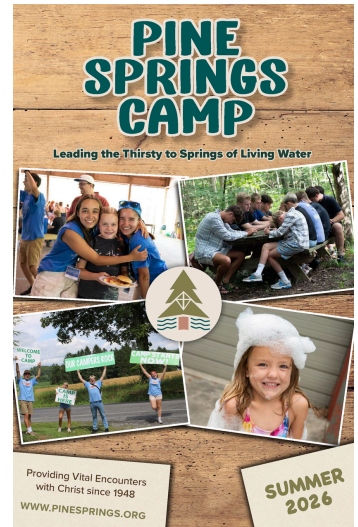
Throughout the years the youth and adults of First Presby have utilized the rich tradition and unmatched facilities to grown in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ.
