Seizing The Moment

John Wesley was the founder of Methodism. Most people know that. What they may not know is that he was the 15th child in his family. They may also not know that he was a classical scholar who studied at Lincoln College at Oxford with a passion for music and architecture. And yet, at age 35, he had a radical encounter with Christ that led him to forsake his well-reasoned plans and enter the ministry. The transforming moment came as he was reading Martin Luther's preface to his commentary on Romans. He described it this way, "My heart was strangely warmed." It was a *Kairos* moment in Wesley's life.

It's a simple calculation. There are 1400 minutes in a day - 1440 moments of time. But, according to the Greeks, there are two different words for time. One is *Chronos*, from which we get the word, "chronology." It's the word used when a sermon goes too long, or the person next to you asks, "What time is it?" It means, "time of day." It signifies the linear progression of moments. But, for the Greeks, there's another word for time that isn't calculated by the ticking of the clock. That word is *Kairos*. It means a moment of significance. It's a moment when your full attention is grabbed, a moment that affects your entire life. It's a pivot point at which the moment is seized, and you are transformed.

Abraham Bininger had such a moment. In 1735, he and his parents left Zurich, Switzerland and made their way to America. In route, both his parents died and were buried at sea. When Abraham stood on the shore of the new continent, he was all alone. Within days, he had a job. Within a few years, he had completed his education, but not before he had had his *Kairos* moment and determined to petition a mission board to send him to St. Thomas to preach to the slaves who populated much of the island.

He had heard of their plight, their misery and degradation. So, he decided to go. But when he arrived, he discovered that he had a problem. St. Thomas was a Danish colony and according to Danish law, no one was allowed to preach to the slaves who wasn't a slave. The reason was simple, the Danes wanted to keep slaves as ignorant and superstitious as possible. So, do you know what Bininger did? He composed a letter to the governor of the island requesting the right to become a slave for the rest of his life.

Now, what would possess a man like Bininger to do such a thing? A *Kairos* moment with Christ that changed everything. That's why, during His time with Moses on Sinai, God said to him, "But if the servant declares, 'I love my master...'" he can enslave himself to that master for the rest of this life. That's what Bininger did. That's what Wesley did. That's what everyone does who seizes the moment and sees Jesus for who He really is. He is the only perfect Master, the One for which we have all been looking. Unlike every other master, He will never enslave us. Instead, when he becomes our true Master, He frees us to be who He's made us to be. May we all have such *Kairos* moments again and again.

UPDATE FROM THE PNC

In November of 2022, the Pulpit Nominating Committee was formed and tasked with finding a candidate to present to you for your consideration as our new Called and Installed Pastor. Nine of us were chosen. Doug had us take a month and study the book, *The Red Sea Rules* in order for us to get acquainted, to form a bond, and to head us in the right direction.

The Rules were as follows:

01

Rule #1- Realize that God means for you to be where you are.

As a committee, we have come to terms with this. We have bonded. We've come to know and care about each other. We like being together. We can almost read each other's minds. We rarely disagree on a candidate. We laugh together and cry together and we value each other's opinions. And we work hard! We are all committed to the task we have been given.

02

Rule #2-Be more concerned about God's glory than for your relief.

We all try to bring glory to God in the way we interact with candidates and with each other, but this one is getting hard. We began reviewing profiles in October of 2023 and now in February 2026, it feels as though we are no further along than when we began. But it could be said that we are a lot wiser. We took a much needed break for Advent, but got back to work in January. Was it easy to begin again? Truthfully, no. But we are back at work.

03

Rule #3-Acknowledge your enemy, but keep your eyes on the Lord.

Characterizing "the enemy" in this process is a bit nebulous. One thing we are confronting is an overwhelming abundance of candidates who appear to be following the culture rather than the teachings of the church. "The enemy" becomes the temptation to lower our standards and expectations, but we are acutely aware that this would not be in anyone's best interest.

04

Rule #4-Pray!

Oh, do we pray! We pray before and after each meeting. We pray for our church, for wisdom, for patience, for guidance, for someone who is "the right one."

05

Rule #5- Stay calm and confident, and give God time to work.

We are calm, but we are beginning to grumble. Not with each other, but collectively against this process which seems so cumbersome. We are beginning to feel somewhat like the Israelites wandering around for 40 years in the desert. But we still have the same nine people actively involved in this process and committed to it. We haven't lost anyone and we haven't lost hope. We know in time, God will provide.

06

Rule #6 - When unsure, just take the next logical step by faith.

We've done this multiple times, whether it be asking for counsel from an outside source, making phone calls to Louisville for advice, traveling to other churches, doing more research, going back to Session for more resources, doing Zoom interviews, and continuing to plow through what is now a stack of 240 profiles.

07

Rule #7- Envision God's enveloping presence.

We listen to God's word at the beginning of every meeting.

08

Rule #8- Trust God to deliver in His own unique way.

We know that God has someone in mind for our congregation and this will happen in God's timing, not ours. Just as God provided manna and water in the desert, we are trusting that He will provide the next leader for our church.

Waterworks at First Presby (We Had a Flood!)

On Monday, February 2nd, one of the pipes in our fire suppression system broke. It was in the new building, not affecting the sanctuary building at all. It did however flood the main floor and the basement. The break was in Room 205 which has been referred to as the library since the new build has been finished. It sustained the most damage along with Room 111, the Youth Ministry office, and is currently still under reconstruction. As you walk through the building you will notice baseboards are missing. These were removed so pilot holes could be drilled and air pumped into the wall to ensure no moisture was trapped in the walls. There are also some missing ceiling tiles in the Document Center, Room 108, and the hallway leading to the Food Pantry and Social Hall. Luckily the storage rooms were not affected. Workmen are at the church daily and hope to have us back to pre-flood status around Easter.

Room Numbers - Room Names

Did you know that all the rooms at First Presby have room numbers and names? What has commonly been called The Library (room 205), will be officially named the "Fireside" room upon its reopening. This room is used for meetings and discussion groups, and we already have a library.

The History and Library Resource Room (room 207) is located in the back hall of the Sanctuary and contains photos and the history of our church along with other worship books and information. If you haven't stopped in, we encourage you to check it out and make use of this valuable resource.


Listed are some of the items that need tackled after a busy year with lots of use.





Rule #9. View your current crisis as a faith builder for the future.

We've had a lot of bumps along the way. The first year we got caught in the Church Leadership Connection's (CLC) redesigning of their website and process which caused us to lose time and effort. The building of the new addition caused us to have to meet off site and do Zoom interviews via laptop computers and phones. Less than ideal. We have "invited to apply" over 30 candidates whose profiles were provided to us through the CLC, only to have them turn us down. We found and engaged through multiple interviews with two candidates who we really liked only to lose them to other churches due to geography and financing. (Since then the Session has graciously raised our financial parameters which is getting us more interest from future candidates.) And now we have the unfortunate flooding of the library which was where we were meeting and from which we were doing our interviews. But we know God is faithful and we will get through this latest bump and keep on going.

10

Rule #10. Don't forget to praise Him.

God is good. God will bring us through this and on into the next chapter in the life of the First Presbyterian Church of Irwin. We don't know why this is taking so long, but we have no doubt that He has a plan for us and we will know what that is in His perfect timing. In the meantime, He has left us in good hands. To God be the Glory!


