## Focusing on our Father

A young boy and his father were sailing a toy boat in Central Park. They were having a grand time until the little boat began sailing out toward the middle of the lake. Instantly, the frightened boy looked up at his father, "Daddy, do something!" His father reached down, picked up some stones and began hurling them toward the boat. In shock the little boy said, "What are you doing, dad? You're going to hurt my boat!" But the more the boy pleaded, the more his father kept on throwing, until he realized that each stone was falling on the far side of the boat, making waves that pushed it closer to the shore.

This past Easter weekend we heard little about the rescue of the members of the crew of the F-16 Strike Eagle aircraft that was shot down over Iran. Within two days both crewmen were recovered without incident. But what happened? What were the details of the rescue? We don't know yet. It's all top secret.

Thirty years ago, things were different. When Scott O'Grady was shot down over Bosnia in his F-16 we quickly learned what happened to him. According to author Tom Wolfe, fighter pilots are not supposed to use words like death and danger, but O'Grady did. At a press conference he said, "I'm no Rambo. All I was, was a scared little bunny rabbit, trying to survive." And survive he did, through a series of unusual circumstances.

According to those who know best, the Soviet-made surface-to-air missile that blew apart his F-16 saved his life by slowing the plane to 300 mph before he ejected. At 500 mph, they say, it would have been like hitting a wall. Within hours of hitting the ground he was out of water. He said, "I prayed for water and within minutes the skies opened in a torrential downpour." After spending six days and nights eating ants and grass, burying himself during the day and creeping around at night. It was at night that his dying \$14-dollar radio was able to transmit a message to rescuers.

When a reporter asked, "How could you avoid the enemy all those days?" O'Grady replied succinctly, "God." Then he paused and said, "Period. Full stop." In fact, in a news conference well after his rescue, he elaborated by saying, "I want to thank God. For God is the One who got me out of the air and off the ground."

The sad truth is, that for most Christians, it takes impossible, harrowing situations like a surface-to-air missile attack for us to perceive the pebbles God is launching our way. But in truth, the Lord is always lobbing them. We just don't perceive it. Why? Because, for most of us, He's the last One we're thinking about. Like that young boat owner, we've got our own point of view. We have our certainties and conclusions. Besides that, we have our highly prized emotions that have been dragging us around for all our lives. It's those emotions that tell us to stand up for ourselves. It's they that say, "You have rights. You will not be pushed around. You've lived a long time, and I know a thing or two." I bet Scott thought all those things prior to the explosion. But shortly after the explosion, he learned his limitations.

June is the month we comply with the dictates of Hallmark and celebrate Fathers' Day. Smack dab in the middle of the month, retailers suggest we remember our dads and reflect on their provisions over the years. May I suggest a different Father to focus your attention on this Father's Day? He's the One who is incessantly casting stones our way to save us from ourselves and make us far more than we are.

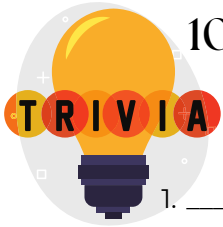

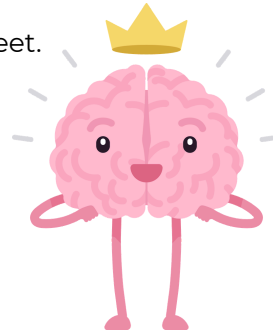

# Carpenter’s Apprentice Appreciation

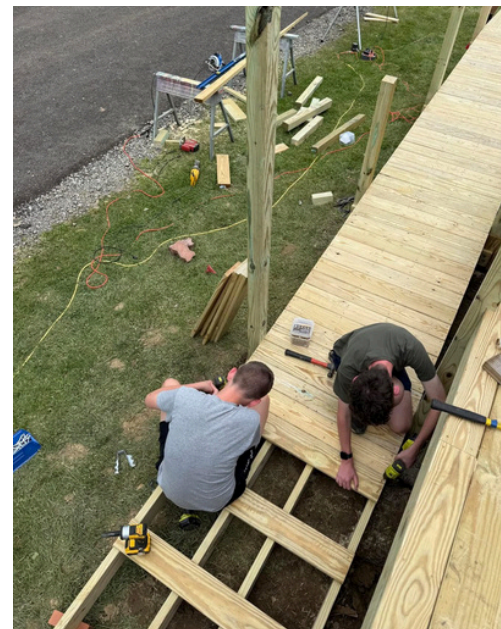
