## Serving The Sovereign

In 1955, at a Billy Graham Crusade in England, John Guest, the Rector Emeritus/Minister-at-large at Christ Church at Grove Farm, came to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. He was 18 years old. He writes, "My parents didn't have a clue as to what to make of it. They never went to church. We didn't pray. We didn't read the Bible. It wasn't part of our lives." After finishing his engineering studies in England, Guest was ordained, served in two churches in England as a youth minister, playing the guitar and singing, and then made his way to America.

His entrance into this country coincided with the Beatles 1964 Ed Sullivan Show performance. Unlike the Beatles who landed in New York City, Guest emerged from the terminal of the Philadelphia International Airport to discover the sights and sounds of the city of brotherly love. But, as soon as he began touring Philadelphia, he discerned that the city was not living up to its name. Rather than a homogenous collection of godly city dwellers, he found an eclectic mix of colors, races, and creeds. But there was no shock in this. He had spent plenty of time in London. But there was one thing that did stop him in his tracks. It was a large banner, strung between two buildings in Independence Square, that read, "We Serve No Sovereign Here!" Suddenly, Guest knew he was on foreign soil.

For 250 years this nation has affirmed the words of that banner, with pride. For anyone familiar with the story of the American Revolution and our progenitors' struggle against the British monarchy knows their battle was against all odds. By every conceivable metric the colonialists should never have been able to withstand the powerful British Army. On many occasions the fledgling Continental Army should have been soundly defeated. But our forbearers were able to snatch victory out of the jaws of certain defeat through grit, determination, and divine grace. It's this GRACE part that is lost on most Americans today.

Grace is the opposite of merit. Grace speaks of dependence, not independence. When Katharine Lee Bates published the words of her poem in 1895, a poem that was to become one of America's greatest hymns, she understood the necessity of America's dependence on divine grace. Writing well after our victory over Britain, she recorded a profound truth that it is only by the superintended rule of a sovereign God that the events of the revolution turned out as they did. She knew that without God's sovereign grace there would be no America the beautiful. Her words stand as a stark reminder of an undeniable truth, "*America! America! God shed His grace on thee and crown thy good with brotherhood from sea to shining sea.*"

In a modern America, filled with disparate parties and affiliations, in a country replete with those seeking to assert their independence from control by anyone but themselves, may we determine to do the opposite. In a country rich in, "Don't tell me what to do, or tell me how to think," let us determine to be poor in spirit. Let our declaration be, "Yes, Lord!" For it is only by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone that any of us can experience true freedom from all tyranny, especially the tyranny of our own selfish hearts. On this 250<sup>th</sup> birthday of this great nation, may we affirm our dependence on Him.

## Report from the PNC

### It's time to “put the PNC on Steroids” — We need your help!

In my library resides a small book by Max Lucado called *Grace for the Moment*. It is a daily devotional with a piece of scripture, followed by his thoughts... similar to Doug's Advent and Lenten devotionals. I have found it to be quite useful when I need a short way to usher in a meeting, or to turn my thoughts in a direction that is more Christ-like. When I was trying to gather what I wanted to say to you on behalf of the PNC, I started through it and thoughts did start to jump out at me. As I report to you today, if the words are in italics, they are from this little book.



In my library resides a small book by Max Lucado called *Grace for the Moment*. It is a daily devotional with a piece of scripture, followed by his thoughts... similar to Doug's Advent and Lenten devotionals. I have found it to be quite useful when I need a short way to usher in a meeting, or to turn my thoughts in a direction that is more Christ-like. When I was trying to gather what I wanted to say to you on behalf of the PNC, I started through it and thoughts did start to jump out at me. As I report to you today, if the words are in italics, they are from this little book.

The PNC is now at 3½ years since our formation and 2½ years in our search for a new pastor. We have invested hundreds of hours individually and thousands of hours by now if you count man hours, and we have yet to find what we are looking for and what we think the congregation is hoping for. Think on these words. *You were knitted together [in your mother's womb]. You aren't an accident. You weren't mass produced. You aren't an assembly line product.* And neither is Doug. I can tell you with utmost certainty after looking nationally and internationally in our search, **God did not clone Doug**. This is a reality that we as a committee have had to accept, and a reality that exists for all of us.

That is not to say we have lowered our standards. We have seen what kind of leader appears to work for our congregation and we are committed to trying -with God's help- to find the person best suited to continue to lead us into the future.

But... We are beginning to become weary with the process. We have been meeting almost every Monday evening since October of 2022. And between Mondays, we quite often have “text” meetings or email meetings. We also have several hours of work between meetings researching Pastor Discernment Profiles, watching sermons, occasionally visiting a worship service or doing a Zoom with a candidate. We constantly have to be reminded that this is God's timing... not ours and it is God's plan... not ours.

*If He is able to place the stars in their sockets and suspend the sky like a curtain, do you think it is remotely possible that God is able to guide our life? If our God is mighty enough to ignite the sun, could it be that He is mighty enough to light our path? If He cares enough about the planet Saturn to give it rings or Venus to make it sparkle, is there an outside chance that He cares enough about us to meet our needs?*

We are constantly looking for outside resources. And at our last meeting we thought... we might be overlooking one resource that could be helping us. YOU!!!! The Congregation.

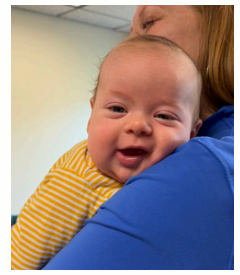
